The safety training is very important as well as the communications training which helps the group on the ground be able to communicate with the operator at all times.

Due to the extreme environments these equipment work under, they are normally put under incredible strain regularly. This means there are plenty of heavy machine jobs available for the maintenance and repair of the equipment. Heavy equipment operators are highly trained workers who are able to diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy machinery in a work shop or on site. Mechanics must be available to transport their tools to a job site and perform maintenance and repair in various conditions.

It could be possible for delivery drivers to get work with just a CDL, though for some jobs, certain endorsements may be required. Like for example, delivering large pieces of equipment or components that are very big for construction projects will need the driver to finish further training to handle and haul huge loads. Usually, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles which are driven by drivers who are trained. These chaperone vehicles normally escort the delivery truck to its destination.
